This week in Forest school the children have been pruning the sticks from the willow house to be recycled as rods to help the seedlings grow. It is good for the children to see us reuse and recycle all of the natural materials. We have also had an Easter egg hunt where the children found different patterned eggs and used their maths skills to match them up to make shapes and patterns.

In the construction area this week some of the children began to build 'London' following on from visits they have been on recently with their families. Maria taught them a song she knew about London 'London's Burning' which led to lots of lots of questions and interesting ideas. Thank you for all of the boxes you have given us for junk modelling as the children were then able to develop this understanding of the world in the creative area by building their own models of London. We are going to continue this next week exploring the fire from the dragon for St George's day and talking about fire safety.

As our seeds continue to grow the children are now beginning to measure how tall they are, this will be tracked over the next few weeks to see which seeds grow the tallest. The children have been learning why we need to keep the seedlings in the greenhouse to protect them from the frost, they have also been surprised with how at the moment the sunflower seedlings and the courgette seedlings both look the same, hopefully we can grow the vegetables and cook them with the children so they can taste them all!
