This week the children have been preparing the area for planting seeds, so the seedlings from the sunflowers can be planted in the ground to help them grown taller and taller. This has supported the children's Understanding the World in learning how things grow and how to look after living things.

The children have also made a large indoor Sun and have been talking about the sun being hot and what makes it shine. The children have also been gaining an understanding of how the sun can help us and our environment. This has also helped support the children's Understanding the World.

The children also helped Adeer to make some pink playdough. The children were able to pour the flour, salt, oil and water into the bowl carefully following instructions from Adeer and then they took it in turns to mix the ingredients together using their hands until it was the consistency of playdough.

This has helped support the children's Mathematic development with Shape, Space and Measure. Through the use of measuring and knowing the correct quantities to make the Playdough correctly.

This has also helped the children's Communication and Language through Listening and Attention and being able to follow instructions.

The children have also started talking about Easter and making Easter pictures this week. They have enjoyed using different colours to decorate egg shapes. Which has supported the children's Expressive Arts and Design in understanding about colour and how different colours can be mixed.

The children have also really enjoyed listening to the Gingerbread Man story and are beginning to act parts out, especially the Run, Run as Fast as You Can section. This has supported the children's Literacy development through Reading.
